

WEEREAS, the New York State Senate does desire to take note and publicly acknowledge occasions that are of great importance to the community; and

WEEREAS, the New York State Senate recognizes today, April 25, 2011, as PARENTAL ALIEMATICW DAY, to raise awareness and understanding of an issue that affects both parents and children; and

WHEREAS, PARENTAL ALIENATION is usually found in high conflict divorce and custody situations and comprises of speaking negatively about a parent to or in front of a child, interfering with communication and visitation; and

WHEREAS, PARENTAL ALIEMATICW takes advantage of suggestibility and dependency of children with the sole purpose of destroying a loving relationship they once shared with a parent; and

WHEREAS, the most common sign of PARENTAL ALTENATION is children opposing or fearing contact with one parent when there is no justifiable cause to explain the child's behavior, and

WEEREAS, PARENTAL ALIEMATICS is considered to be a form of child abuse as the aliemating tactics used on children are confusing and frightening, thus robbing them of their sense of security; and

WHEREAS, PARENTAL ALIENATION is seen as a way to deprive children of their right to love and be loved by both parents; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Senate recognizes PARENTAL ALIEMATION DAY as a way to raise awareness through education and understanding of this serious problem and how it could affect both children and their parents.
